

TWF AND THE SDGS

In September 2015, the UN General Assembly adopted the 2030 Agenda for sustainable development. All governments in the United Nations agreed upon new global commitments that, if achieved, would end poverty, inequality, injustice and climate change, among others, around the world by 2030. There are 17 of these commitments known as the Sustainable Development Goals, i.e. the SDGs. Each of the goals tackles a different problem.

In Nigeria, **TosaadecWorld Foundation, TWF**, is working, in line with the SDGs, to empower economically disadvantaged children and people out of extreme poverty through innovative programmes that improve access to basic necessities of life, and promote the well-being of the planet. We do this by providing access to quality education and vocational skills training to children in vulnerable situations, supporting women and youths in need to access economic empowerment programmes and decent work opportunities, assisting marginalised families and communities to have improved and sustainable access to adequate food, clean water, dignified sanitation and reliable energy, and working with our government in the fight to ensure basic necessities of life are within reach for all people, at all times, in all places, including rural areas.

TWF works to ensure regular access to adequate food for the 50 million people who are hungry, and to reduce food waste and prevalence of hunger.

TWF works to reach and expand access to quality education and vocational skills training for the 18.5 million disadvantaged children who are out of school or training.

TWF works to ensure that safe, clean water sources, improved sanitation and hygiene facilities are within reach for the millions of people who lack access.
